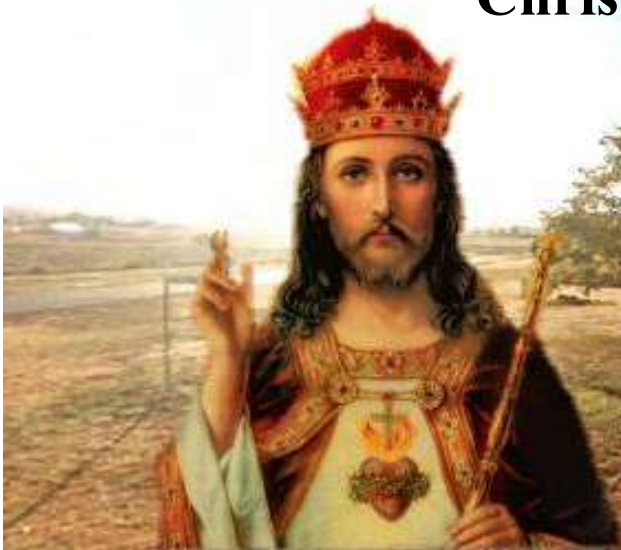

The Fatima Five First Saturdays: Three Fruits

1. To those who faithfully follow our Lady's requests, she has made this wonderful promise to "assist at the hour of death with the graces necessary for salvation." This means that **our Blessed Mother will be present at the hour of death with the actual grace of final perseverance.**

2. This devotion obtains **the conversion of sinners.** "So numerous are the souls which the justice of God condemns for sins committed against me that I come to ask for reparation. Sacrifice yourself for this intention and pray." (Our Lady to Sr. Lucy at Tuy, June 13, 1929)

As Lucy put it: In consideration of this little devotion, They [Jesus and Mary] wish to give the grace of pardon to souls who have had the misfortune of offending the Immaculate Heart of Mary. (Letter of May 1930)

3. In His Providence, God decided that **the peace in the world** will depend on this devotion.

Whether the world has war or peace depends on the practice of this devotion, along with the consecration to the Immaculate Heart of Mary. This is why I desire its propagation so ardently, especially because this is also the will of our dear Mother in Heaven." (Sr. Lucy, March 19, 1939)

And for the third time he said to her: "You must always thank God for whatever happens to you in life! Do you understand?" and she said: "Yes, Father. I understand."

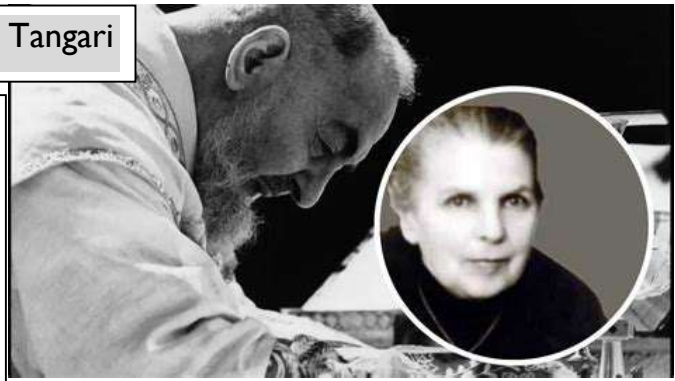
She left the confessional and went home. The following Sunday she was at Mass and some friends came to rouse her at the end of Mass because they said that her house was burning down. She went back and there the house was in an absolute rage of fire, and she stood on the footpath and said: "Deo gratias!" (Thanks be to God.) And of course, her friends thought her to be a fool and that she had lost her mind.

But after everything had cooled down, she rustled through the rubble and found three things that alone were totally untouched by the flames. — everything else was destroyed.

The first of these things was a wax statue of the Holy Child of Prague. The second of these things was a picture of Our Lady Immaculate, and third of these things was the manuscript copy which she had written on the life of Padre Pio. All the pages of the book were untouched by the flames.

She went back to confession to Padre Pio about a week or ten days later and as she lined up there ready to go to confession, Padre Pio walked by and he turned to her and said: "Now do you understand that you must thank God for all that happens to you in life?" And Madame Tangari said that from that very moment, she knew she had to live for God, and for God alone.

A Saint of Scotland

ST. NINIAN
September 16

Chances are you have never heard of St. Ninian. But he is known in Scotland, where a number of places still bear his name. And visitors and pilgrims still go to see the cave that was his hermitage, long ago, on the southwestern coast.

Living in the fourth century, son of a Galloway chieftain, Ninian was the very first of the great Scottish missionaries. He traveled a great deal, in particular taking the Gospel message to the Picts, and he sailed as far north as the Orkneys and the Shetlands—a dangerous trip in those days. He also built at Whithorn the first stone church ever seen in Great Britain: his *candida casa*, or "white house."

St. Ninian gingery muffins

In Scotland they eat spicy, gingery St. Ninian Muffins. Just why ginger and why muffins I haven't been able to ascertain. But they are so tasty that I am willing to eat first and ask later. Let's eat these muffins in honour of St. Ninian, and that old Scots courage. The recipe is from *The Highland Fling Cookbook* by Sara M. Walker.

Preheat the oven to 400° F.

Sift together the flour, baking soda, salt, and spices into a large bowl. In another bowl, combine the molasses, sugar, butter, and boiling water.

Add the liquid mixture to the dry mixture a little at a time. Beat in the egg. Do not overbeat. The batter may be lumpy. Leave it that way for best results.

Pour it into buttered muffin pans and bake for 20 to 25 minutes.

Yield: 12 muffins

Ingredients:

1½ cups flour
1 teaspoon baking soda
¼ teaspoon salt
½ teaspoon cinnamon
¼ teaspoon nutmeg
¼ teaspoon cardamom
1 teaspoon ground ginger
½ cup molasses
¼ cup brown sugar
¼ cup (½ stick) butter
½ cup boiling water
1 egg
